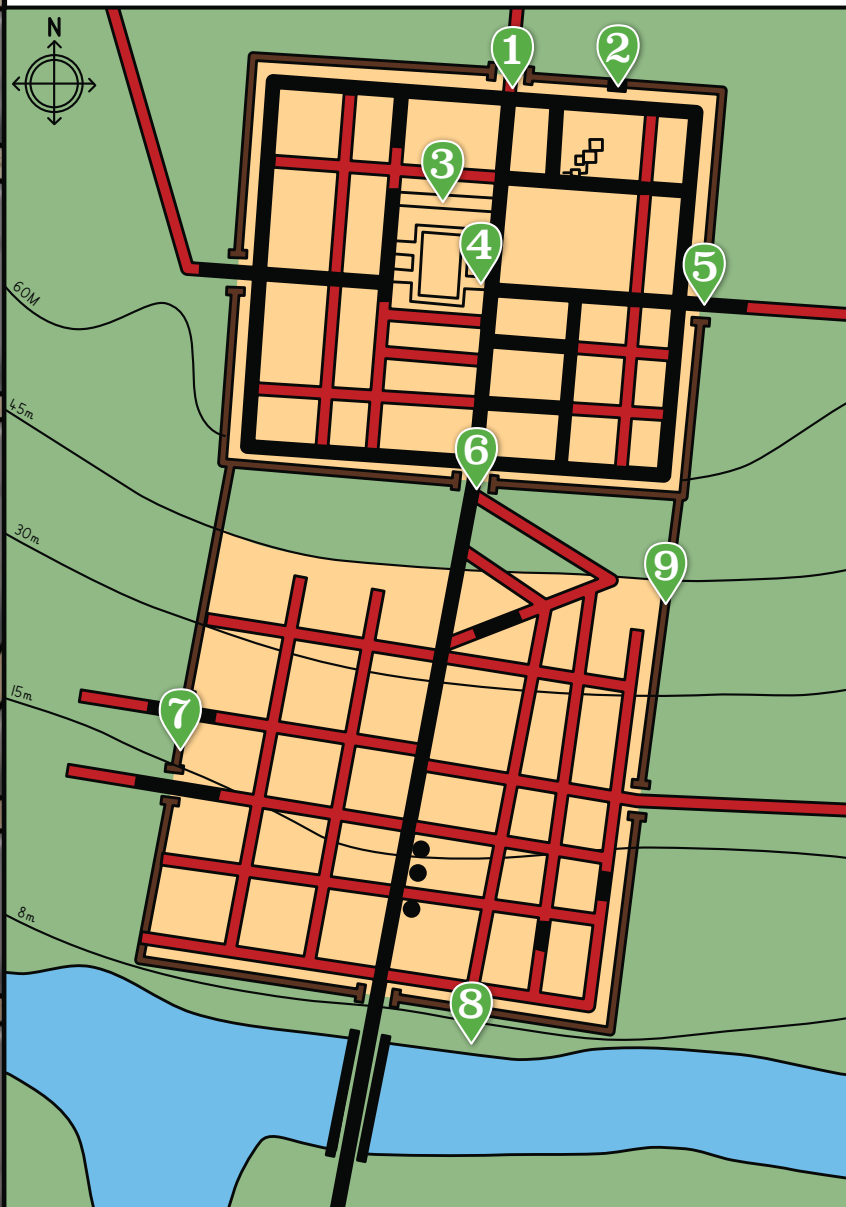

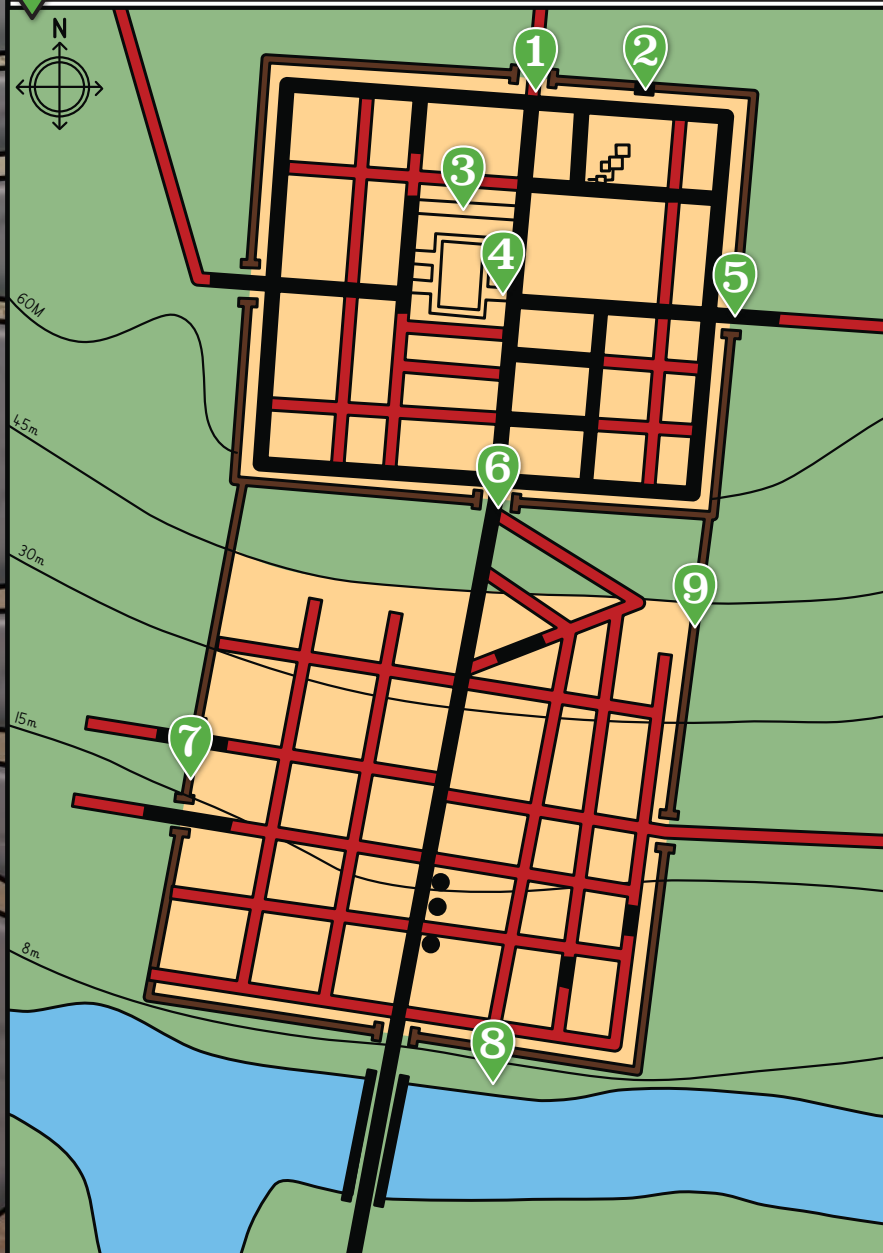

Roman feature of Lindum Colonia

Photo

1. Newport/
North Gate

D. This was the northern most entrance into Lindum Colonia.

2. Water tank

C. This is all that remains of the water tank that once stored water for Lindum Colonia

3. Basilica wall

I. This is all that remains of the North Wall of the Basilica, once the centre of Lindum Colonia.

4. Columns of
Roman Forum

F. These circles mark the place along what is still called Ermine Street where the columns for the Roman Forum once stood in the centre of Lindum Colonia

5. Upper East Gate

A. This is all that remains of the one of the towers of the Upper Eastern gate into Lindum Colonia

6. Upper South Gate

G. The Stone wall separating these two shops on Steep Hill in Lincoln, is all that remains of the Upper South Gate of Lindum Colonia

7. Lower West Gate

B. These ruins are all that remains of the Lower West Gate of Lindum Colonia

8. Postern Gate

E. Postern gate was once a pedestrian entrance through the lower south wall of Lindum Colonia alongside the River Witham. Originally, merchants and traders would have used it to access the River Witham, which, in Roman times, was lapping close to the wall. It's remains are hidden from view underneath a modern building.

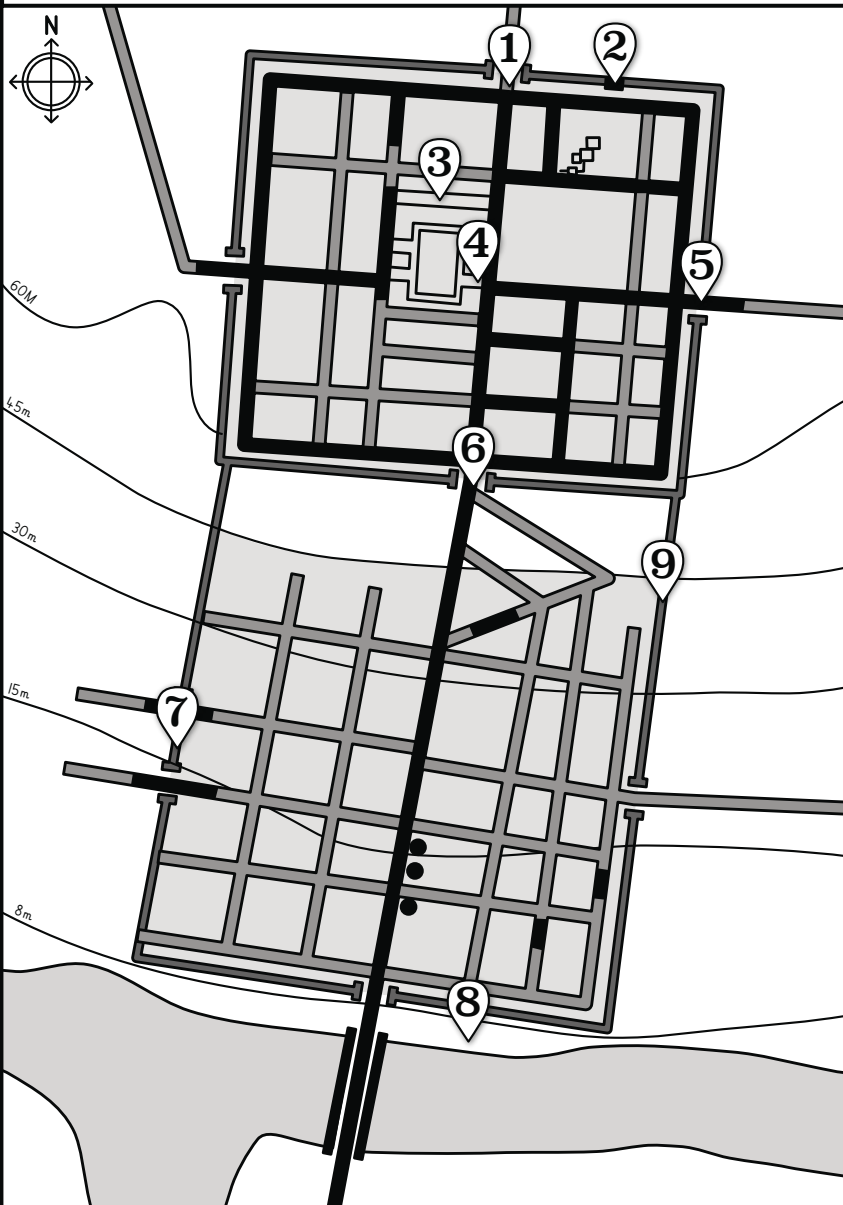
9. Defensive ditch near

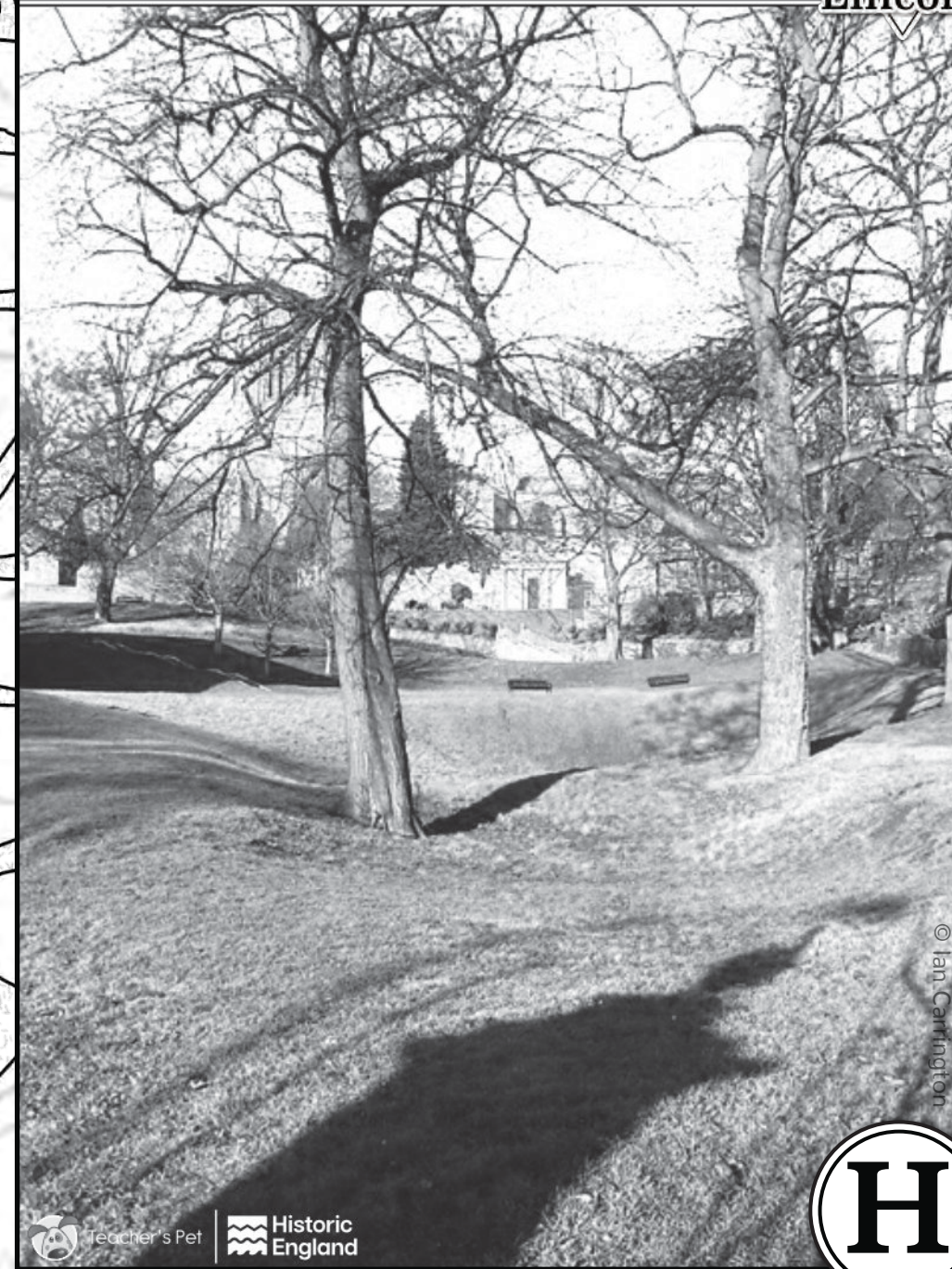

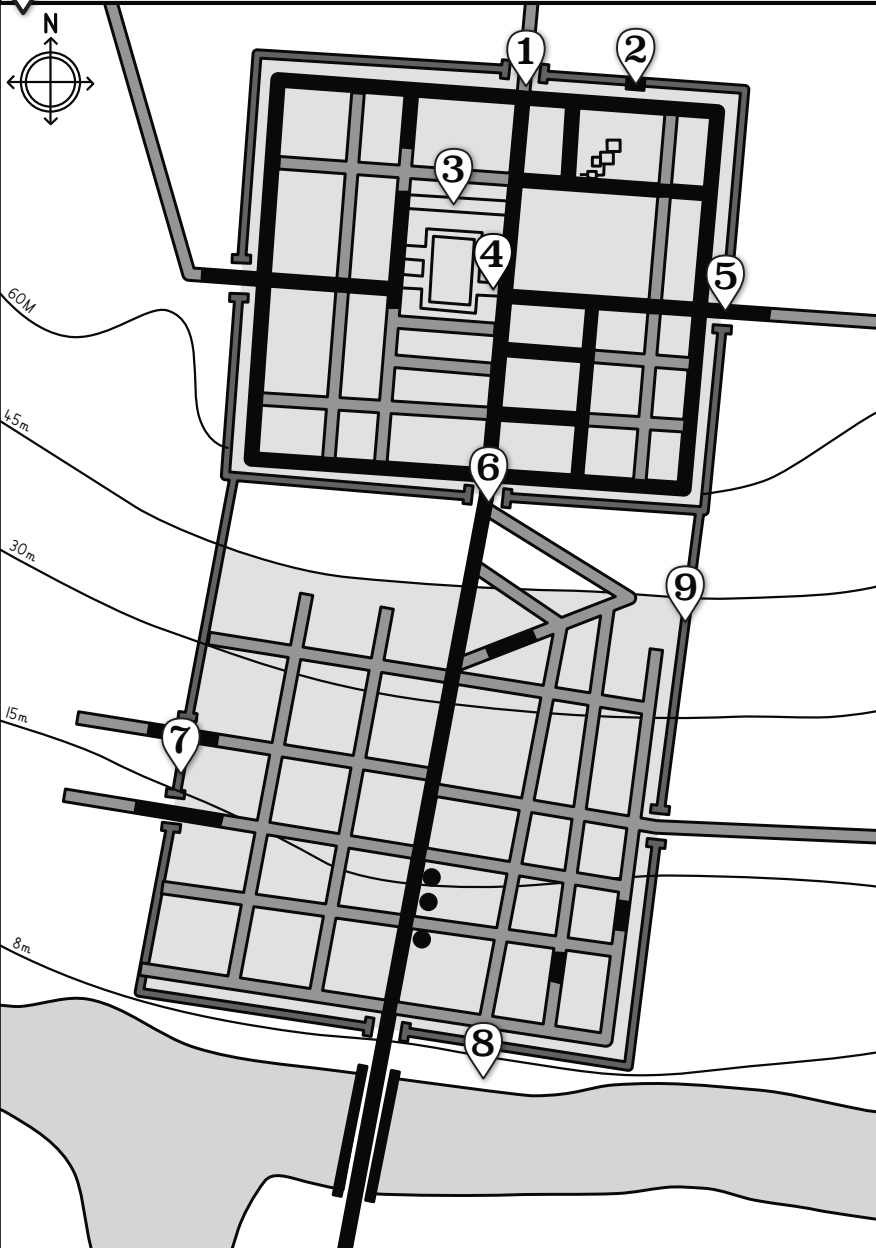

Roman feature of Lindum Colonia	Photo
1. Newport/ North Gate	D. This was the northern most entrance into Lindum Colonia.
2. Water tank	C. This is all that remains of the water tank that once stored water for Lindum Colonia
3. Basilica wall	I. This is all that remains of the North Wall of the Basilica, once the centre of Lindum Colonia.
4. Columns of Roman Forum	F. These circles mark the place along what is still called Ermine Street where the columns for the Roman Forum once stood in the centre of Lindum Colonia
5. Upper East Gate	A. This is all that remains of the one of the towers of the Upper Eastern gate into Lindum Colonia
6. Upper South Gate	G. The Stone wall separating these two shops on Steep Hill in Lincoln, is all that remains of the Upper South Gate of Lindum Colonia
7. Lower West Gate	B. These ruins are all that remains of the Lower West Gate of Lindum Colonia
8. Postern Gate	E. Postern gate was once a pedestrian entrance through the lower south wall of Lindum Colonia alongside the River Witham. Originally, merchants and traders would have used it to access the River Witham, which, in Roman times, was lapping close to the wall. It's remains are hidden from view underneath a modern building.
9. Defensive ditch near lower Eastern wall	H. The defensive ditch that once protected the Lower Eastern Wall of Lindum Colonia can still be seen in Temple Gardens
